WRITING FICTION: TWELVE IDEAS TO CONSIDER

Once There Was A Bullfrog (Gibbs Smith) and many, many more.

- 1 KNOW YOUR STORY.
 - ...Write the pre-history of your story.
 - ...Write the post-history of your story.
- ...If you have trouble writing the pre- and post- histories, then you probably don't know your characters well enough.
- 2 PLOT YOUR STORY.
 - ...Does your conflict make your story interesting?
 - ...At key turning points, consider other directions your story could go.
 - ... Can you summarize your plot?
- 3 SEE THE SHAPE OF YOUR STORY.
- ...Understanding the shape of your story will help you see if there is anything that doesn't belong. Knowing the shape beforehand will also help you write your story. Make sure every effect has a cause.
- ...Make a cause-and-effect line of your story. Make sure there is a good motivation for everything that happens in your story.
- 4 STICK TO YOUR STORY. DO NOT DIGRESS.
- 5 CREATE REAL CHARACTERS.
 - ...Are any of your characters stereotypes?
 - ...Do each of your characters seem like real people to you?
 - ...Name one thing that makes your character stand apart from the other characters.
 - ...Is your character neither perfectly good or not perfectly evil?
 - ...What do your characters want? What motivates them?
 - ... Use specific details to make your characters come to life.
- 6 CHOOSE CHARACTER'S NAMES CAREFULLY.
 - ...No allegory names (Samuel Justice, Dorothy Love)
- ...No distracting names, unless you want the names to distract, as in slapstick or bizarre humor.
 - ...Are your names easy to tell apart? (Dan/Van)
 - ...Are you names stereotypical? (Mary, Joseph, Sam, etc.)
 - ... Avoid alliterative animal names, i.e. "Charlie The Chipmunk".
- 7 SHOW DON'T TELL.
- 8 KEEP VIEWPOINT CONSISTENT.
- 9 STICK WITH EITHER REALITY OR IMAGINATION. DON'T GO BACK AND FORTH BETWEEN THE TWO UNLESS YOU MAKE IT CLEAR WHAT YOU ARE DOING.
- 10 CONSIDER YOUR AUDIENCE.
- 11 KEEP A UNIFIED TONE AND STYLE.
- 12 KEEP MESSAGES SUBTLE. DON'T MORALIZE.
